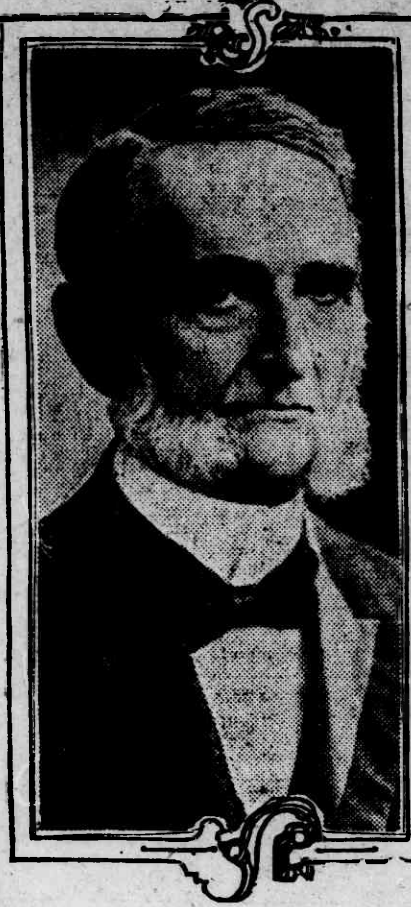

CAPT. SMYTH DENIES MERGER STORY.

Declares That Reports of Giant Combine of Cotton Factories Have No Foundation in Fact.

Spartanburg, S. C., April 15.—Concerning the report from New York to the New Orleans Times-Democrat that steps have been taken in the Northern city to form a huge merger of cotton mills not only in South Carolina, but also in Alabama, John A. Law, president of the Saxon Mills, who was mentioned in the dispatch as prominently connected with the merger, said last night:

"The report is greatly exaggerated. A definite statement in regard to the matter will be made in due time, it will come from the office of Capt. Ellison A. Smyth."

"Whether or not the Saxon Mills will be included in the merger has not been settled. The proposition will soon be submitted to the stockholders and board of directors."

It is reported that J. P. Morgan and the Chemical National Bank will finance the merger. When Mr. Law was asked if this was true, he said:

"I can not answer questions regarding things which are not yet ready to be given to the public. The matter is progressing slowly, and the plans can not be disclosed until something definite has been done. When that stage is reached, an announcement will be made."

It is known that Mr. Law will be vice-president of the Pelzer corporation, the \$12,000,000 cotton mill combine.
