At a meeting of interested parties in Raleigh recently plans were set on foot to commence the survey of this route early in May. Numerous delegates from the nineteen countles to be traversed were in attendance, and reports of that meeting indicate of the willingness of these several counties to carry their part of the burden was given recently when Rowan county agreed to put up \$1,500 per mile for that section of the road passing through that county. The act authorizing the highway, passed by the last legislature, prescribed \$50 per mile, but Rowam put in \$1,500 for good measure.
