City Water Board Discusses Situation

Supt. Vest Writes Congressmen Webb to Secure Hydraulic Engineer—Mr. Patrick of Norfolk Suggested.

The board of water commissioners met yesterday afternoon informally in the council chamber at the city hall for the purpose of talking over the water situation and seeing if there could be suggested some feasible plan for relieving it.

The most prevalent opinion was that the Brier Creek station, which was formerly used, would have to be put into operation if the long-needed rains do not come soon to relieve the situation.

There was some discussion about a site for tapping Catawba river, in case the board should be forced to impound the water.

Congressman Webb Writes. In pursuance of resolutions passed recently asking that the government be asked to send an expert hydraulic engineer here to advise the local authorities as to the best means of obtaining a better water supply, and as to the best site for tapping the river, Mr. Vest wrote Congressman Webb, asking his influence in securing the engineer.
