Hornets Take Great Game From Patriots

Bauswine Wins Out in Great Pitchers Battle From the Deacon-Agnews Batting and Catch of Lowman Features--Greensboro Got Only 2 Hits.

In undoubtedly the prettiest game of the season the locals took the third game of the season from the Patriots by the score of 1 to 0. Not only that, but it took 19 innings to do it in, it was clearly a pitchers battle between Bauswine and Morrissey, the former having the better of the argument all the way through. Hits were scarce all through the contest and the few that got on were either due to errors or else to bases on balls which were rare. Bauswine was in exceptional form, giving only three bases on balls during the whole game and striking out nine men and not hitting a single one. Morrissey, though, did not walk a single man but hit one, striking out only one.

The nearest visitors got to scoring was in the first inning when, after giving Rickard two strikes he knocked several fouls and was finally walked. Doyle sacrificed him to second and he went to third on a wild pitch. Fuller struck out but Rickard was not content with staying on third so he started to steal home. It was two strikes on Rickard, in the first, got past second.

Up until the tenth the Hornets had not gotten a man as far as second. Morrissey was going as good, if not better, than Bauswine and only the minimum number of players had been at bat. In the first Agnew singled, but was out going to second, while the same was true of Wofford, in the second, in the tenth though it was different. Agnew, the first man up got his second single off the Deacon and was sacrificed to Garman. Cross singled to third while Coutts singled to right, scoring Agnew.

There were few features in the field, except the jam-up fielding of both teams. Two errors are accorded to both Corvin and Seigfried, but none of them amounted to anything. There were three up and three down for Charlotte for eight out of the first nine innings. In the fifth there were only three men at bat, but Wofford was hit by a pitched ball, which broke the monotony of only three men coming up in one inning. The fielding features were divided between Doyle, Agnew and Lowman. The first two took in all sorts of chances without an error, while the latter went over beyond the foul line and pulled in, after a hard run, a drive from Bauswine's bat. But, to tell the truth about it, there wasn't much to it except the pitching of Bauswine and Morrissey, unless it was the umpiring of Canny. This time he was behind the bat calling balls and strikes and his decisions alone marred the contest. The fans showed their disapproval of his decision several times, and it took away a lot of the pleasure of the game.

The Patriots looked as if they might break the thing up in the ninth, but as luck would have it, they failed. Doyle led off with a single, but was forced at second, when Fuller grounded to third, while Clapp was forced when Doak grounded to the shortstop. Both Stewart and Malcolmson caught good games, the former catching every man that tried to go down to second on him.
