Admiral Count Togo, Japanese naval hero of the Russian war, who has sailed from Liverpool aboard the Lusitania for New York, where his official visit of one month in this country will begin. The little admiral was given a rousing send-off as a farewell by the English people when he sailed from Liverpool.

YELLOW AUTOMOBILE NUMBER TAGS TO BE USED FOR GEORGIA

Atlanta, August 7.—Within the next week or ten days yellow automobile number tags will begin to make their appearance in Georgia.

The new series has already arrived at the secretary of state's office, beginning at 10,000 and running to 20,000. The first series is almost exhausted.

The tags have a yellow background with black figures, instead of the aluminum background, and the figures are stamped solidly in the plate instead of being movable.

It is believed that the new tags can be read nearly twice as far as the old ones, which will probably please the police more than it does the automobile owners.

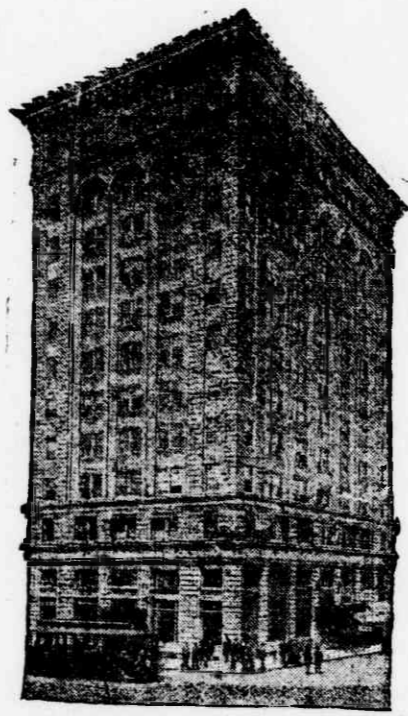
