Schools Will Open on Sept. 5th, as Usual—Site Matter Deferred

The public schools will open on the 5th of September as usual and not two weeks later as asked for by petitioners to the school board... Action in regard to the expenditure of the \$20,000 school bond money, in Wards 5 and 6—Belmont and North Charlotte—was deferred until a map of the property proposed for sites can be made.

The meetings of the municipal boards are becoming historic, by reason of length and character... From 8:30 to 11:45 last night the school board sat in council to hear one new proposition—and attempt to settle an old one.

The new one was in the form of the petition noted in The News, asking that the opening of the schools be delayed for two weeks on account of weather and water.

The old one, that of the expenditure of the \$20,000 bond money apportioned to the section known as North Charlotte, including Belmont and other sections on the northeast... The board, in executive session at 11:30 voted to make no change in the opening date, thus settling the new proposition.

The old one in regard to school site, or sites, for wards 5 and 6 remained until the end of the evening... The old leaders from each ward were at the hat again last night. The old arguments were repeated and talkers and listeners soon found themselves in the same labyrinth of difficulty as they floundered in at the last "site" meeting.

Mr. E. M. Cole cut the knot of difficulty, at least for the present, by this proposition: "I ask that this board do not decide this matter now. It is a matter of serious import, and should not be settled hastily..."

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seconded and carried unanimously, this being considered an excellent price for said lot. Propositions were submitted from Mr. H. M. Irwin and Wadsworth Land Company, but the lot offered by Mr. H. M. Irwin not being considered at all desirable for school purposes, a motion to accept the proposition of the Wadsworth Land Company of a site corner Fourth street and Summit avenue, provided the terms are changed providing for a school building to cost \$7,500, carried unanimously.

No report can be made as to the site for school building in Belmont and Elizabeth, the parties to whom this matter of securing a location not having made a report as to what they had secured.

Your committee recommends favorably the acceptance of the offer of the Charlotte Consolidated Construction Company for two additional lots at Dilworth school at a cost of \$2,900. Your committee unanimously recommends that the offer of Mr. N. J. Sherrill of \$150 per front foot for 26 feet or more adjoining the Fourth Ward school property be accepted.

Your committee also recommends that the \$20,000 be spent in erecting a grammar school on the lot in first ward, corner Ninth and Brevard streets, the present building to be used for a high school at said point. It is also recommended that all these wings, et., be removed from the school grounds, and athletics be substituted.

Minority Report. To the Honorable Mayor and Members of the School Board of Commissioners of the City of Charlotte, Gentlemen: In filing a minority report, as member of building and grounds committee, in the matter of selecting a site for the school building for Wards 5 and 6—or North Charlotte—I do so for the following reasons, viz:

1st—We should stand by the original proposition (the campaign circular issued by the school commissioners previous to the bond election, which designated thoroughly the point where said building would be located.

2nd—The site offered by the Pegram-Wadsworth Land Company (after looking at other sites)—proved to be the central site at present, and will be for the next ten to 20 years; also it is a saving to the taxpayers of the city of at least \$3,600 for a site which would not be central.

3rd—It would be the essence of folly to divide the \$20,000 for two school buildings, as the school board will be unable in the future to maintain two first-class schools in every particular—that is to equip the buildings in modern school style; and above all furnish a corps of teachers for each grade sufficient to meet the requirements of all concerned.

4th—The school census, as taken by Prof. Huxley (at the expense of the board) shows a small difference in the number of school children in these two wards respectively; therefore, this point is not debatable in favor of the present site, nor or in the future.

5th—In placing this school building, gentlemen, we have the opportunity of a life-time, and one that will not present itself again in the next 20 years, and I ask that you do not allow a few selfish and narrow arguments, by those not directly interested, appeal to that which is our duty in this matter.

6th—Gentlemen, something like 200 signers appeal to you to place this new building on the Pegram-Wadsworth site, which would give their children the same showing to school facilities as those of the opposition—Belmont.

7th—In the name of justice to all and special privileges to none, may you vote in the interest of the people at present and the future in locating this school, which is to be the place of training the minds of our boys and girls for future generations. Thanking you for your support in that which is eternally right, I am, J. J. WILLIAMS, Minority Member Building & Grounds Committee.
