WANT NEW FRENCH PORT FOR UNITED STATES STEAMERS

Paris, Seut. 2 .- Claude Casimir Pe rier, son of the former president of the republic, is making a campaign in favor of substituting Brest for Havre as the French port for steamers from the United States. He admits that the inferior place held by French steamers in Atlantic traffic is due to the activities of the eGrmans and English in building larger and faster steamers but contends that the French could better their position by reducing the distance between France and York which a change to the more westerly Brest would bring about. The distance from Brest to Paris is considerably longer than that between Ha vre and Paris. Nevertheless, M. Perier declares, the inauguration of a series of fast express trains would notably decrease the existing train voyage and the total saving of time between Paris and New York would be at once a distinct advantage to French transatlantic traveling.


