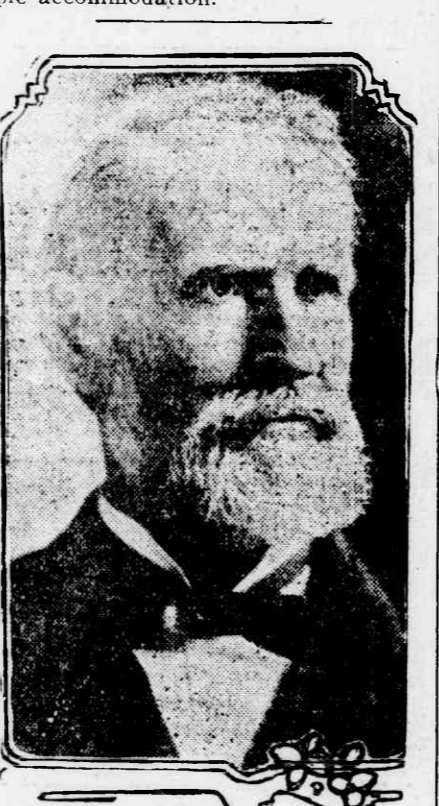

**POPE APPOINTS ARCHBISHOP.**

Rome, Sept. 6.—Pope Pius today ratified the decision of the constitutional congregation, presented by Cardinal De Lal, appointing the Right Rev. Joseph M. Koudelka, of Cleveland, as auxiliary archbishop of Milwaukee.  
The appointment of the Right Rev. Mgr. J. M. Laval, vice-general of the arch-diocese of New Orleans, to be auxiliary archbishop of New Orleans also was ratified. In addition Mgr. Laval is created titular bishop of Hierocassarian.
