Terrific Slump in U. S. Steel Stocks

New York, Sept. 21.—The stock market was thrown into confusion today by selling of U. S. Steel stocks on an enormous scale. From almost every part of the country orders poured in to sell the stocks of the "billion dollar combine." Confusion prevailed on the floor of the stock exchange as

brokers struggled to dispose of their holdings. Prices crumbled rapidly. The preferred stock slumped 5 1-2 to The preferred stock slumped 5 1-2 to 105 1-4, its lowest price since 1908. The common fell to 59 1-2, a loss of 4 points, its lowest record since 1909. On Sept. 1 the preferred sold at 115 and the common at 70. During the forenoon transactions in Steel stocks exceeded yesterday's total of 250,000 charges.
