State, he used kaolin from eastern Tennessee and made a profit from it using Tennessee coal at \$3.25 per ton; while competitors in east Liv-Can be cut into about 14 building belt, and Akron, O., the heart of the gas belt, operated at a loss.

Mr. Fred Oliver stated for the ben efit of the assemblage that Tennes see coal could be secured in Charlotte at \$3.25 per ton, while the Pocahontas variety could be obtained at \$3.50 or \$3.55 per ton.

Mr. Watts said in view of that fact that he believed a plant here would pay handsomely. 
