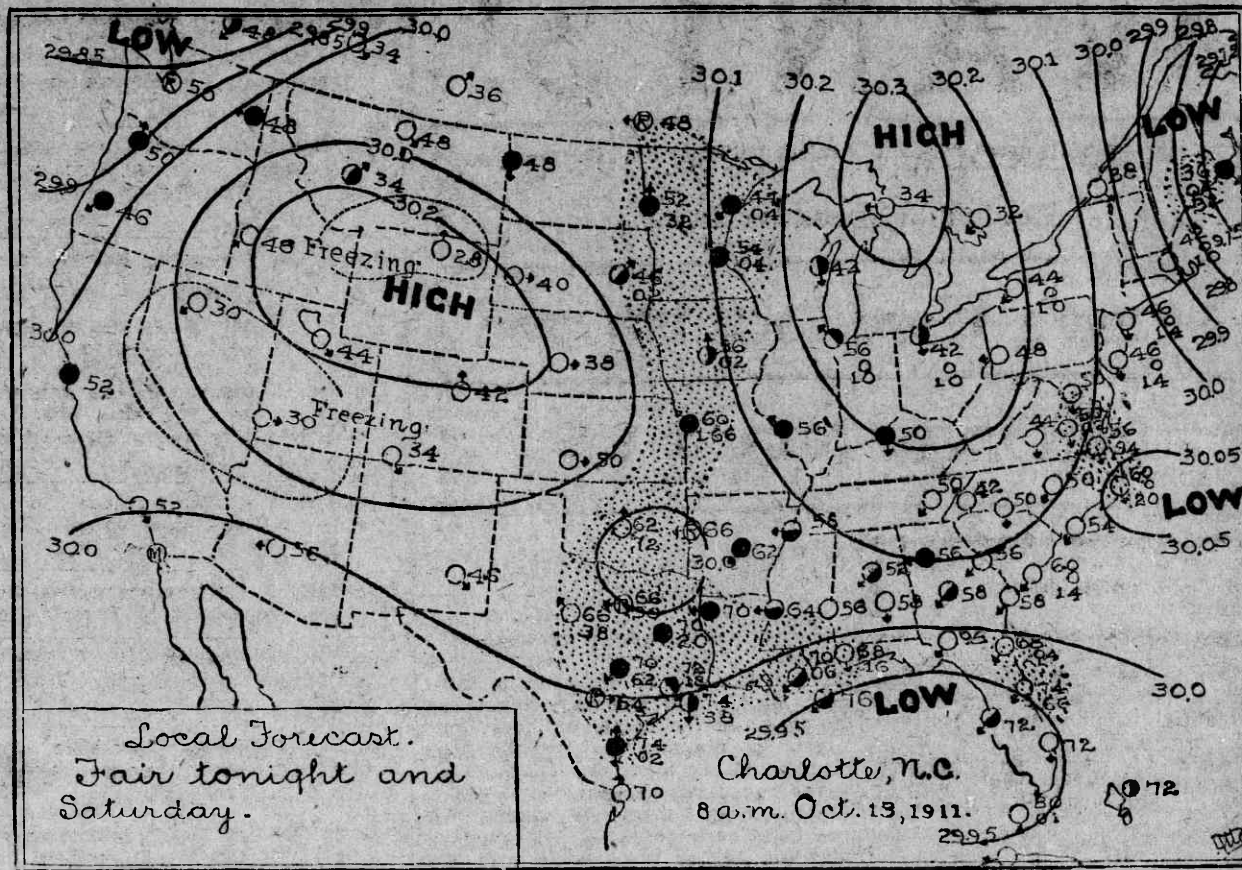

New York Cotton

New York, Oct. 13.—Cotton opened easy at a decline of 7/16 points in response to weak cables and heavy Southern selling orders. Trade interests were fair buyers at the decline and covering by shorts was extremely active but the demand was hardly sufficient to sustain prices.

New York Stock Market

New York, Oct. 13.—Unusually active trading in American Tobacco securities marked the opening. Within the first five minutes the four per cent bonds to the value of nearly \$1,000,000 changed hands. The price rose to 90 1/2. The market was irregular, most of the active issues receding by small fractions.

New Orleans Cotton

New Orleans, Oct. 13.—Cotton futures opened steady at a decline of 2 to 4 points on indifferent cables and fairly good weather conditions. Immediately after the call a spurt of profit taking by shorts put the more active months to 2 points over yesterday's close but this aroused fresh short selling and the offerings became so heavy by the end of the first half hour of business the trading months were 8 points under yesterday's final quotations.
