Sudden Skies Threaten To Interrupt Third Game of Great Series

Warmer Weather Promises Comfort for Spectators if Rain Will Hold Off—Capacity Crowd Expected to be on Hand.

Dark Day Will Call For Pitchers With Steam—Coombs and Mathewson Likely Choice Betting Favors Giants at 6 to 5.

By Associated Press. New York, Oct. 17.—The official forecast of probably showers for the third game of the world's championship baseball series was sustained by actual weather conditions early today.

Third Bout Fortune having favored the Giants and the Athletics each with a victory, the two contending teams for the world's championship honors came together today at the Polo Grounds for the third contest of the series.

Bettered favored the Giants at 6 to 5. When the first spectators began straggling toward the Polo Grounds the new Brush stadium with its tiered rows of empty seats loomed through the fog-like clouds.

Less Enthusiasm. The gathering outside the bleachers gazed before the entrance was opened showed somewhat less enthusiasm than on the morning of the first game of the series.

The examination of Talsman Z. T. Nelson has cleared the atmosphere, it was agreed, by defining many issues involved in the effort to determine whether James B. McNamara is guilty of causing the death of Charles J. Haggerty in the Los Angeles Times explosion and fire.

The defense may offer an alibi for McNamara or may rest solely upon the gas explosion theory in support of which it has gone as far as Europe for expert evidence.
