### Gladden Tourists Reach Roanoke

By Associated Press. Roanoke, Va., Oct. 18.—In one of the worst rainstorms that has ever visited this section in years, the Gladden tourists arrived here at 3:20 o'clock yesterday afternoon and will probably remain in Roanoke today. Because of a bad stretch of road south to Rocky Mount some doubt is entertained as to the tourists being able to proceed today because of possible damage to roads caused by the downpour yesterday. Referee Walker says he will make a run over some of this stretch to see if conditions are safe before the tourists are permitted to start. The only section worth mentioning was an accident to car No. 19, 10 miles north of Roanoke. This car was delayed a few hours but arrived safely in Roanoke at 5:30 yesterday afternoon. A reception was tended the travelers last night at Hotel Roanoke by the chamber of commerce.

### Number of Balls Pitched Yesterday

By Associated Press. New York, Oct. 18.—Coombs and Mathewson pitched a total of 243 balls in the 11 innings which made up yesterday's game of the Polo Grounds. Of this number Coombs pitched 128, an average of almost 12 an inning, and Mathewson got away with less work than his opponent, pitching only 115 balls, an average of about 10 an inning. Both teams showed a strong tendency to hit the first ball yesterday. The Giants hit the first ball that Coombs pitched on six occasions and the Athletics went after Matty's first one no less than 13 times. Only three times during the game did Mathewson pitch more than five balls to one batsman and Coombs made a similar record.

### NO EXCUSE FOR CALLING OFF GAME.

Chicago, Ill., Oct. 18.—Postponement of the Cub-White Sox ball game yesterday by representatives of the national commission, who have charge of the city championship series, was contrary to the wishes of both Presidents Murphy and Comiskey. The commission's representatives, without consulting any one, postponed the game at 10:30 a. m. because at that hour conditions made it doubtful if the game could be played. The weather cleared shortly after noon and the rest of the day was nearly perfect for baseball. One of the rules promulgated by the national commission to govern world's and other post-season series expressly states that the question of the fitness of the grounds shall be decided by the umpires. President Comiskey, of the White Sox, said: "I am glad of one thing and that is that the public can not blame either club owner in this case." President Murphy, of the Cubs, said: "Both Manager Chance and myself were willing and anxious to play and without wishing to criticize any other person we deny any responsibility for calling off a game which we think should have been played."
