

Board Contracts For Two Pumps Water Board at a Sitting Which Lasted Till Midnight Decides on Two Turbine Pumps at a Cost of \$3,767.

The board of water commissioners at a meeting held Saturday night accepted the alternate bid of Whitted & White, of Charlotte, for two turbine Morris machine water pumps.

The two pumps will have a capacity of 3,500 gallons a minute each. Whitted & White will furnish the pumps, fully braced and with bronze vanes, with 74 percent efficiency guaranteed.

The bids submitted without including erection were: R. D. Wood & Co., \$3,900; Whitted & White, \$2,860; Allberger Pump Co., \$3,920; Platt Iron Works, \$3,460; American Well Works, \$2,064; Allis-Chalmers Co., \$3,985; Buffalo Pump Co., \$4,265; Henry R. Washington Co., \$3,400; American Machine Co., \$3,644; American Well Works, \$2,464.

The following bids included erection: Allis-Chalmers Co., \$6,532; Buffalo Pump Co., \$4,269; Washington Co., \$4,985; Platt Iron Works, \$4,160; American Well Works, \$2,464.

Owing to the fact that only three firms had offered bids only three electrical equipment at the meeting of the board last Tuesday and that one of these had to be counted out because the check for one-tenth of the aggregate bid had not been submitted at the proper time, the board decided to call off all offers along this line and ask for a new series of bids.

The task of looking over all the bids of both classes was too great to be finished in one night, although the board did not adjourn till midnight, although the board did not adjourn till midnight. Just before adjournment the board agreed on the two turbine pumps as stated above.
