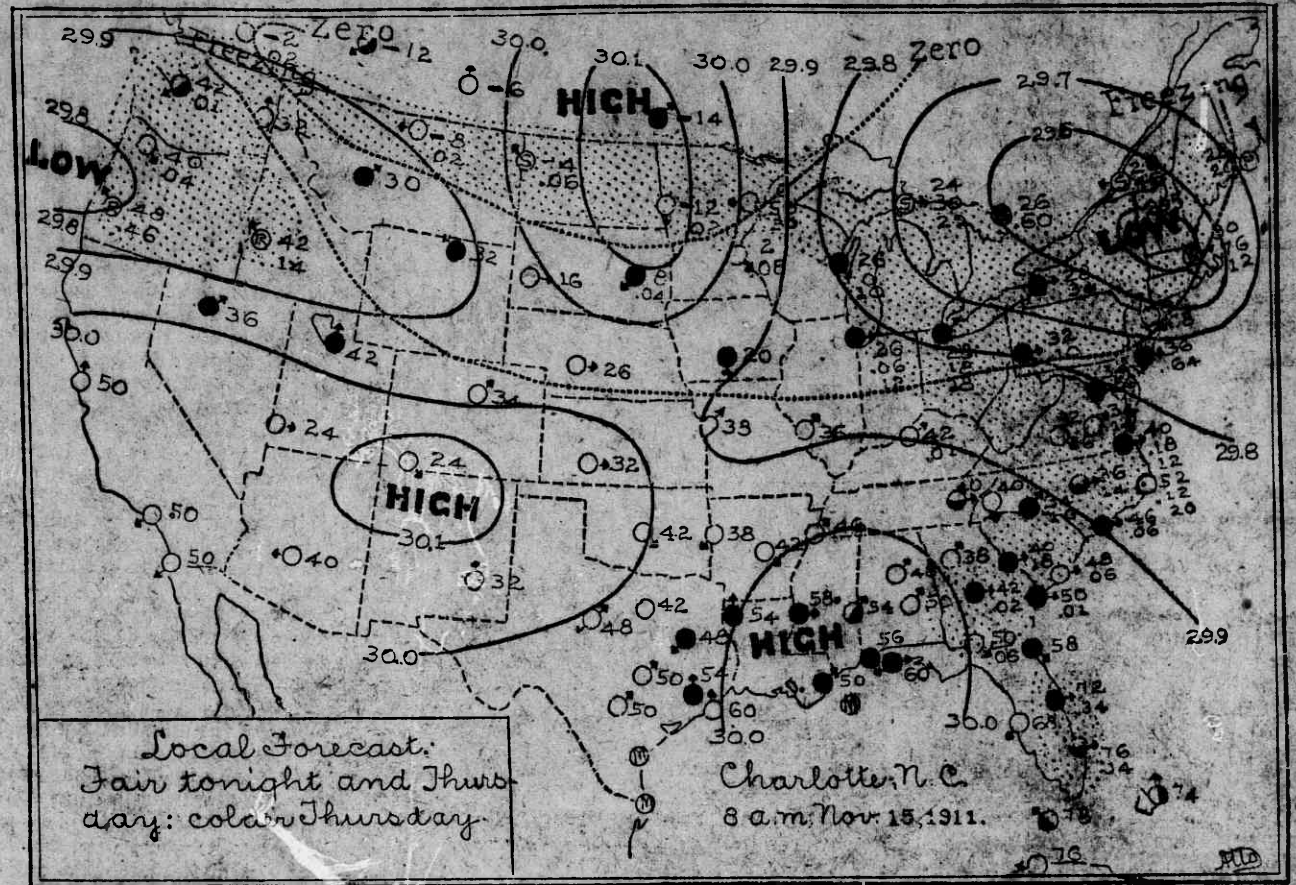

Observations taken at 8 a. m. 76th meridian time. Isobars or continuous lines, pass through points of equal air pressure. Isotherms, or dotted lines, pass through points of equal temperature; they will be drawn only for zero, freezing, 90 degrees and 100 degrees. Symbols indicate state of weather: ☉ clear; ☁ partly cloudy; ☂ cloudy; ☔ rain; ❄ snow; ⚡ report missing. Arrows fly with the wind. First figure, minimum temperature for past 12 hours; second, 24-hour rainfall, if it equals .01 inch; third, wind velocity of 10 miles per hour or more.

THE WEATHER.

Forecast for North Carolina. Fair tonight and Thursday; cold Thursday and in extreme west portion tonight.

Weather Conditions. Pressure conditions have changed very rapidly in the past 24 hours. Pressure is high over the South and Southwest, but the temperatures are considerably higher than on Tuesday morning.

A barometric depression is located over the New England coast. To the westward of this is a high pressure area over the Dakotas. This latter area is accompanied by colder weather there, and in the Canadian sections.

The freezing line will be noted on the map well to the southward, including almost one-half of the country.

The indications are for fair weather tonight and Thursday, in this vicinity, with colder Thursday.
