

Truant Officers Fined \$10 Each

Messrs. Joe Orr and John McGraw of the Police Department Fined for Being Off Duty—Quarters for The Veterans and Militia Discussed.

Sergeant Joe Orr and Patrolman John McGraw, of the police department, were fined \$10 and the costs last night by the city executive board for being absent from their posts of duty all of last Tuesday.

They came to headquarters yesterday morning, donned their uniforms and went on duty. Chief Christenbury had informed the mayor Tuesday evening that the officers were missing and yesterday morning Chief Christenbury suspended them from the pending an investigation by the executive board last night.

They stated before the board last night that they went to the Hickory Grove neighborhood, 7 or 9 miles from the city, opossum hunting in company with Mr. Thomas Wilson, a friend. They did not notice the passing of the time, they said, until they suddenly realized they could not get back to the city in time to go on duty at 7 o'clock.

Both officers stated that it did not occur to them that they were violating rules by leaving the city without permission until they were at their destination. They stated further they had later realized they had broken the rules and were sorry they had done so.

As to Veterans' Quarters. Alderman E. S. Williams appeared before the board in his capacity of chairman of the aldermanic committee looking after the interests of the local militia. He reported that the salutation of his committee as to providing for the veterans and the militia was to convert the offices of City Physician Hawley and Chief Sanitary Inspector Roberts into quarters for the veterans.

Messrs. Murphy and Williams said they were not ready to vote on the matter. They were appointed a committee to investigate the matter. Alderman Williams being invited to meet with them.

Mr. J. O. Walker appeared in behalf of the Arab patrol, a part of the local Masonic Shrine, asking the board to fix a rental price for the use of the auditorium from Nov. 27 to Dec. 2, inclusive, during which time the Shrine will hold a bazaar in the building.

Messrs. T. T. Allison and T. C. Toomey appeared in behalf of property owners on East Fourth street, who want that street improved between College and Brevard streets.

In the case of Mr. Thomas W. Alexander against the Charlotte Power Co., the board referred the case to Mr. W. J. Chambers and City Attorney Brenizer for a further investigation, whose results they will later report.
