PRINCETON MEETS YALE ON GRIDIRON

New Haven, Conn., Nov. 18.—Football banners of Princeton once more flaunted defiance at Yale in the streets of New Haven today but with a south-east rain storm sweeping in from Long Island Sound at a hurricane pace, both banners and bearers seemed bedraggled and dispirited at least during the forenoon over the prospects of a good football test on Yale field later in the day.

Footballists dislike to play a three cornered game in which the weather has a hand. The element of luck has usually figured much larger in such contests than under dry conditions. Today, however, the supporters of Princeton looked on such an element with more complacency than those of Yale for the reason that good fortune has walked hand in hand with the orange and black in every game so far this season.

In the aggregate weight Princeton has a slight advantage over Yale but in the latter team the weight is more evenly distributed. Spare suits were provided by the trainers in order that the players might have a complete change between the halves, while little packets of rosin were provided for the back field men to insure better handling of punts.
