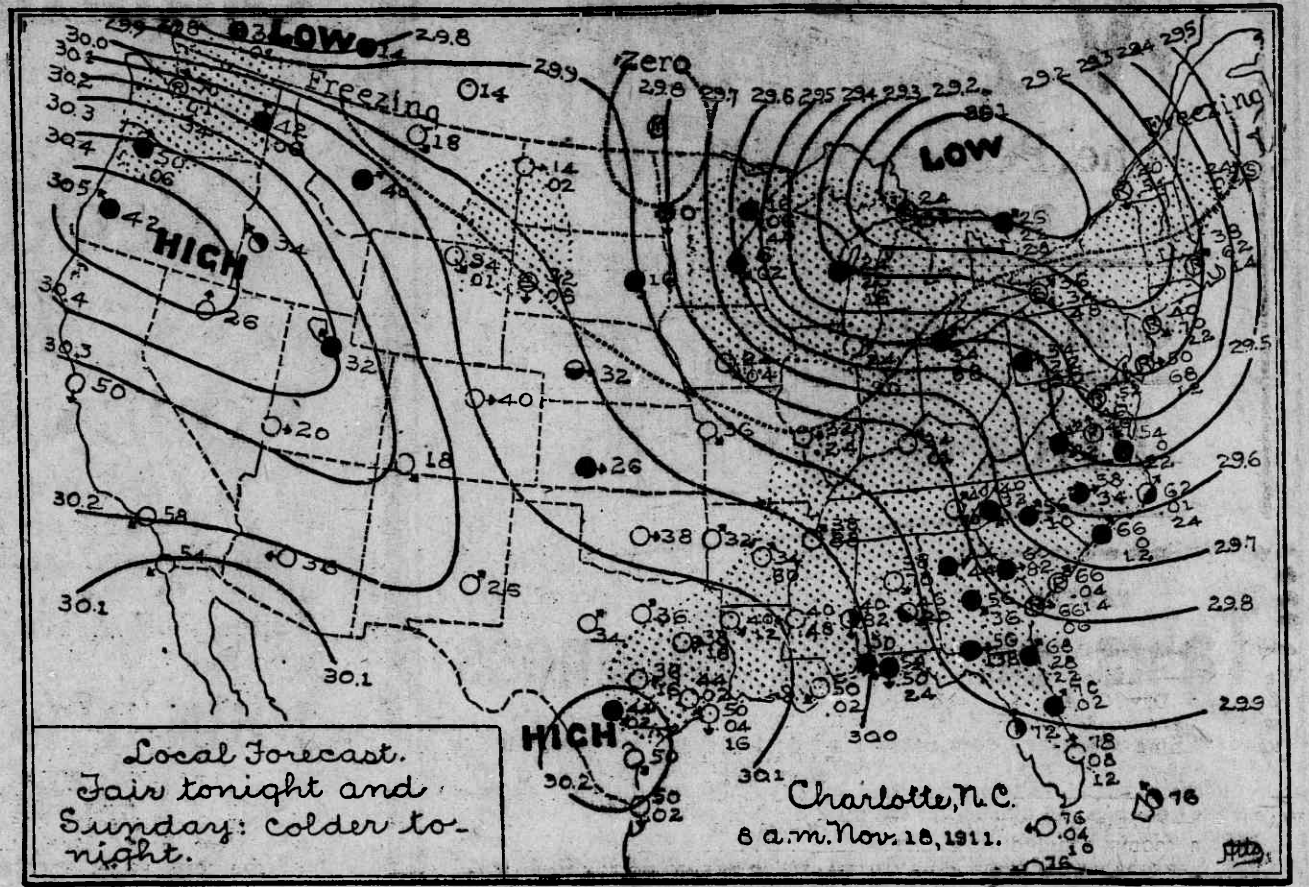

New York Cotton

New York, Nov. 18.—Cotton opened steady at an advance of one point to a decline of 1 point and showed very little feature during the early trading. Liverpool was a shade better than due, which caused some covering, as it suggested that the reported curtailment in Manchester on account of troubles in China was of little immediate importance and generally speak- ing business was in the way of evening up for over the week end and the census report on Tuesday. Fluctuations after the call were irregular with December relatively easy on reports that shipments in this direction were increasing and that the concentrated long lines had been considerably reduced and the general market ruled about two to four points net lower.

New Orleans Cotton

New Orleans, Nov. 18.—Cotton futures opened steady at unchanged prices to 3 points down. Cables were indifferent. The weather map was unfavorable, altogether too much cold and rain being shown in the cotton country and this prevented a decline after the opening. Shorts bought moderately to even up over Sunday and this was about all the support the market had but it proved enough to hold it steady and to put prices 1 point over yesterday's close at the end of the first half hour of business.

World's Visible Supply

New Orleans, Nov. 18.—Secretary Hester's statement of the world's visible supply of cotton shows the total visible to be 110,299 against 9,818,575 last week, 3,779,513 last year. Of this, the total of American cotton is 3,529,299 against 3,363,574 last week, 3,129,513 last year, and of all other kinds, including Egypt, Brazil, India, etc., 578,200 against 555,000 last week, 670,000 last year.

New York Stock Market

New York, Nov. 18.—Wall Street—Stocks remained almost stationary at the opening today. The demand was light and trading listless. The largest changes were an advance of 1-2 by Lehigh Valley and a decline of an equal amount by United States Steel. The Special stocks were lister substantially, particularly Union Pacific and the copper group but the general market showed little spirit.

Chicago Grain

Chicago, Nov. 18.—An increasing demand at Liverpool for forward shipments helped bring about firmness here today in the market for wheat. Smaller receipts at winter wheat markets in the United States tended also to give prices a lift. The opening here was 1-8a1-2 higher. May started at 1.00 3-8 to 1.00 5-8, the same change from last night as the list taken altogether. After touching 1.00 1-4 the price rallied to 1.00 5-8.
