## O. P. HEATH & CO'S. CREDITORS MET THIS MORNING

This morning the first meeting of the creditors of O. P. Heath, bankrupt, was held at the county court house, Mr. W. S. O'B. Robinson, referee, called the meeting. The creditors present voted for a trustee, the nominees being R. A. Lee, Esq., and Ed Huck, Esq. Mr. Huck received the vote of \$17,523.03. Mr. Lee received the vote of \$13,573.19. As neither man received the vote of a majority of the creditors the referee ruled that there had been no election and called for further nominations. There were none and the referee appointed Mr. R. A. Lee trustee and he was put under a bond of \$5,000.

The appointment of appraisers was left to the attorney for the bankrupt, and to the trustee. The referee will appoint the man they name.

Mr. O. P. Heath took the stand and was examined as to his business since the attachment. The examination was conducted by Mr. J. E. Johnston of Warsaw, S. C., representing a number of northern cotton future firms.

Trinity College, Durham, Nov. 20.—The second annual declamation contest held at Trinity College under the auspices of the "9019" Society of the college, will be held here on December 1, the day after Thanksgiving. Hundreds of letters have been sent out to the various high schools preparatory institutions in this state and Virginia and South Carolina inviting them to send representatives to compete for the prize which will be given. At the contest last year there were thirty-two high schools represented, and a great deal of interest was manifested in the event. The medal was carried off by Mr. Jeter McKinlay Pritchard, the young son of Judge J. C. Pritchard, of the United States circuit court, who was representing Mars Hill College. 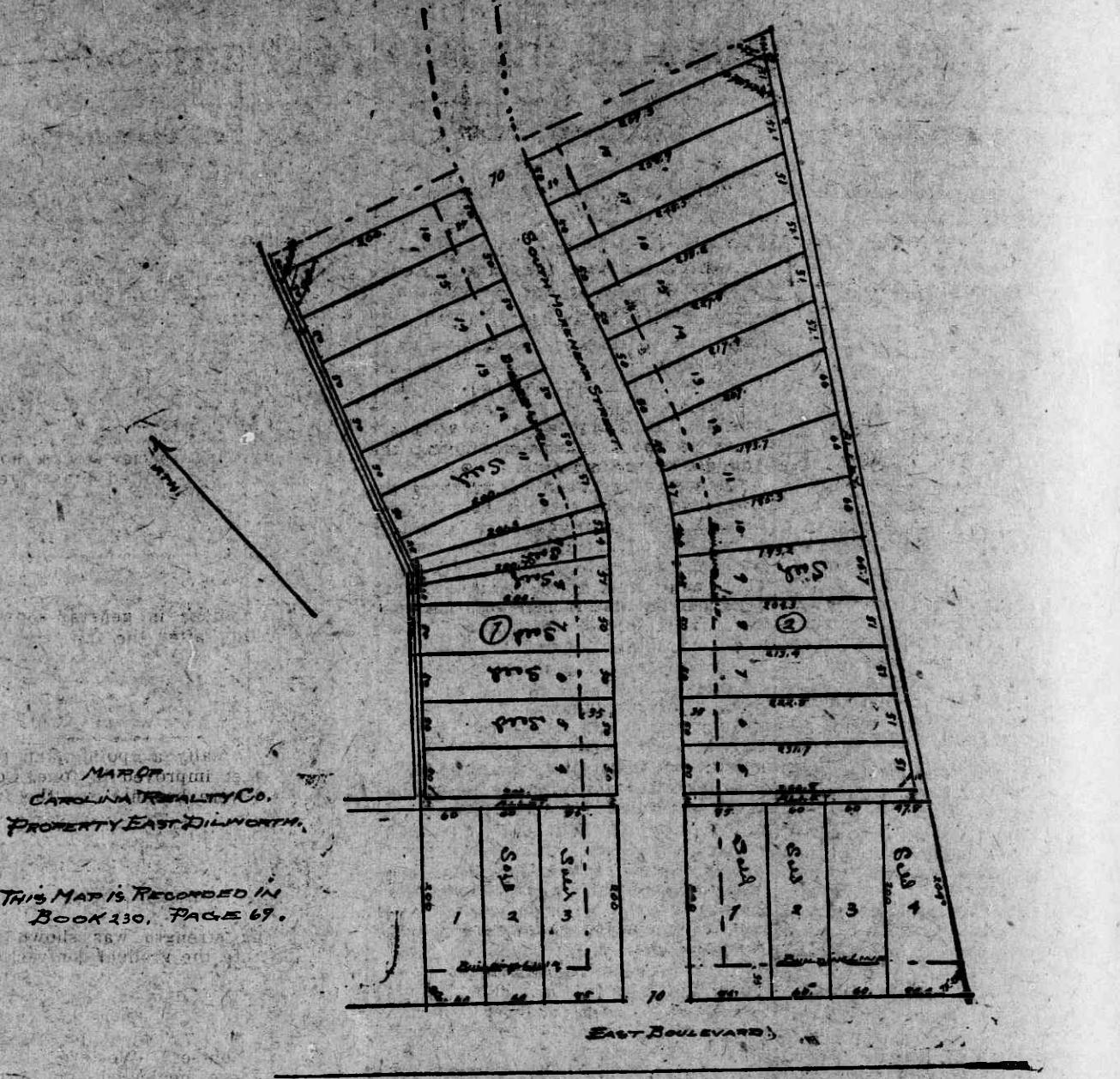
