NOAH'S ARK FIGURES IN PETITION TO GOVERNOR

Atlanta, Nov. 28.—Noah's Ark is a vital issue in a petition just received by Governor Slaton from a certain citizen of a Georgia county, the name of which has been withheld, charging that the superior court judge and solicitor have discriminated in favor of negroes and against white men in blind cases treating the white men with unreasonable severity and letting the negroes go.

The name of the county, which would identify the judge and solicitor, is not made public, because there is inferior evidence in the petition which strongly indicated personal animus on the part of the writer, himself a white man who had been tried for selling whiskey.

The most striking part of the letter occurs in the following words:

"Eight white human souls were saved in Noah's Ark. The negro must have gone in the ark as an orang outang."

The writer argues that according to the Bible there was no darker aboard the ark, and contends, therefore, that the negroes must be descendants of animals. His theory is not entirely Darwinian, however, as he claims that only the negroes, and not the white people, are descendants of monkeys.

PLAY THOUGHT TO LIBEL IRISH RACE WILL STAND.

New York, Nov. 28.—American managers of the "Play in Boy of the Western World," announced today that the play which was interrupted last night because some of the audience thought it libeled the Irish race, would be repeated tonight and every night for which it was originally billed. Another special police guard has been asked.

The authorities say that the arrest of ten of last night's disturbers, seven of whom paid fines, has not ended the matter.

Today they are investigating reports that the attempt to mob the play was prearranged and they are trying to find if any Irish societies whose members were ejected from the theatre last night are officially responsible.

Engineers Here on Next Friday

On Friday of this week the most distinguished body of road-building engineers that ever came to the city will be visitors here for a day. The party will be composed of fifty highway experts who are the guests of the Indian Refining Company, of New York. They will stop here for the special purpose of inspecting Mecklenburg's roads, with especial reference to the ten miles of liquid asphalt binder manufactured by the Indian Refining Company and laid on the Pineville, Statesville, Camden, Yorkville and Lawyers' roads.

The body of engineers are from eleven different states of the South and West and various parts of a trip country. They are being given a trip to the grand prize race of the Savannah Automobile Club over the famous Chatham county roads to be held on November 30. The road oil department has the matter in charge. The party is traveling in private cars completely equipped in all details. They will go to Savannah tomorrow, where they will be met by the Chatham county commissioners, and will be taken by auto to one of the model convict farms of the state, where they will be treated to an old-fashioned barbecue. All of Thursday will be devoted to witnessing the grand prize race and Friday morning the engineers will arrive here and spend the day looking over Mecklenburg roads.

The entire trip is in charge of Mr. A. B. Chamberlain, manager of the road oil department, assisted by Mr. Samuel E. Finley, sales manager of the Southern office in Atlanta. The Greater Charlotte Club will take the engineers out in automobiles to see the Mecklenburg roads and local autoists are asked to cooperate with a committee, consisting of Messrs. C. O. Kuester, W. T. Corwith, D. P. Hutchison and M. C. Mayer, in transplanting the engineers to various places about the city.
