SOCIALISTS WILL WIN IN GERMANY

(By COUNT VON ELPBERG) Berlin, Nov. 27.—The Socialists' overwhelming triumph at the approaching general election for the Reichstag on January 1st, 1912, is predicted by a special commission of investigators sent out by the government to ascertain the electoral prospects throughout the country. At present the Socialists deputies in the Reichstag number fifty out of a total of 397, but the government commission predicts that the elections will produce 150 Socialists, bringing that party into a commanding position by combination with Liberals.

Upon his return to the Hill Dr. Venable announced that the Rt. Rev. Arthur S. Lloyd, D. D., had accepted the invitation to deliver the baccalaureate sermon at the commencement, 1912. Dr. Lloyd was for many years Bishop Coadjutor of the Protestant Episcopal Church of Virginia, and is now president of the board of missions of his church in New York city.

TO REGULATE LENGTH OF LADIES' HAT PINS.

Atlanta, Nov. 28.—Dr. George Brown, of the Fulton county delegation in the general assembly, will probably introduce a measure at the next session to regulate the length of ladies' hat pins. Several more or less serious accidents have occurred in Atlanta street cars and elevators already, as well as in other large cities, and the hat pins worn by fashionable women here sometimes measure 20 inches or more in length, and protrude beyond the wide hat bands. The hat pins were brought forcibly to Dr. Brown's attention yesterday by a personal experience. Dr. Brown, who is an eye, ear and throat specialist, was treating a young lady's eyes when she suddenly turned her head, and drove a long hat pin clear through one of the doctor's fingers. Dr. Brown is in no sense content to "get even" with the young lady who jabbed his finger. He knows that was a mere accident, but it brought the general proposition to his attention in a striking way, and he feels he owes a duty to the public.
