PRINCETON SPORTS SELF-SUPPORTING.


Princeton, N. J., April 23 .- The annual financial report of the Princeton Athletic Association published yesterday shows that football and baseball are the two only self-supporting sports indulged in by the Tiger athletes. Total receipts of the last football season were more than \$56,000, of which \$31,200 was taken in at the Yale-Princeton game and about \$16,000 at the Princeton-Harvard game, Football's total expenses were \$23,600 of which the largest, \$5,487 was for coaching, leaving a net revenue of \$33,369 for the season. The baseball team took in more than \$33,000 and eft a net revenue of approximately


