# Summer Slows The Legislature

The Summer Session passed just as slowly for the Student Legislature as it did for everyone else on campus. Not a great deal of business came before the Legislature, but it did have its moments. The most important accomplishment this summer was the passage of three bills which deal with procedure of business.

Student Legislature Bill 66-67-1, entitled Duties of the Chairman of the Elections Committee, requires the said Chairman notify all persons elected to positions in Student Government, the Annual and the Newspaper within 48 hours after the ballots are counted.

S. L. Bill 66-67-2 is the Establishment of Time and Place For Induction of Student Legislature Members and states that all newly elected members must be sworn in no later than two regularly scheduled meetings. If the member is not inducted during his time period and does not submit an acceptable excuse for his absence then he will be asked for his resignation.

The third bill, S. L. 66-67-3, is the Procedure To Be Followed When a Legislator's Overall Average Drops Below 2.0. In the past, Legislators had frequently been given "periods of grace" when their grades fell below a 2.0 overall in the Spring. This bill states that a Legislator must resign his position if his overall average drops at any time during the year. If this occurs at the end of Spring Semester, an interim replacement is appointed by the President of the Student Body for the Summer Session. Class elections must be held within 10 days after Fall Semester starts to elect permanent replacements for those classes that do not have full representation.

The Legislature approved the final budgets, on July 25, presented by the Finance Committee for the various organizations on campus which receive Student Activities Fees. A total of \$29,990 was distributed among eleven organizations according to their needs for the coming academic year. The Union and the Annual received the bulk of this sum with \$15,000 and \$8,000 going to each respectively. The Legislature made a precedence this year by allotting \$300 to the Editor of the Newspaper for a Discretionary Fund. The only other discretionary Fund granted with Activities Fees is to the President of the Student Body.

During the last three months,

several Legislators were lost due to grades or a conflict of interests.

## U. Rules Made

Union Chairman Frank Jones asks that students abide by the following rules while in the Union.

Smoking is permitted in all areas of the Union except the ballroom. Special permission is required for ballroom smoking.

Food and drink are permitted only in the cafeteria, card playing area, and gameroom.

All reservations for space in the Union must be obtained from the Union Program Director, without exception.

Students must not tamper with the thermostats in the Union.

No one will be admitted to the gameroom unless there is an attendant on duty. Students must comply with rules governing the use of the gameroom and failure to comply with these rules could mean the closing of the gameroom for an indefinite period of time.

Card-playing, chess, and any such games as those are permitted only in the area designated for that purpose.
