Commenting on the game itself, Coach Murphy said that the "brightest spot so far is rebounding, as expected. Six foot seven inch Bob Lemmonds, six foot five inch Don Keel, and jumping jacks Jerry Anthony, Eddie Goodall and Robbie Snipes are producing very strong board work. The addition of Ben Basinger, another jumping jack, will add even more rebounding strength second semester."

"I would say at this time we are better than when we played our first game of the 1965-1966 season," he remarked. "We do not shoot as well, but we are better in every other phase of the game and are much better balanced." Coach Murphy concluded by saying that a good manager would improve the team "tremendously". 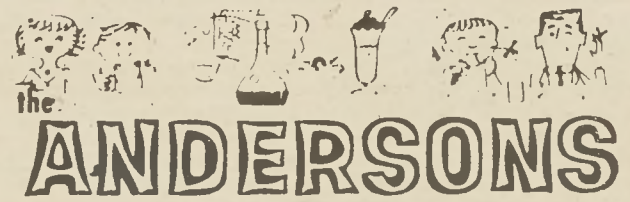
