Hoopers Will Hit Hardwood At Home, Hoping For A Win

The Forty-Niners will open the basketball season at home in the Garinger Highgym, Saturday, Nov-ember 19, with King College of Brystol. Tennessee. Tipoff is at 8:00 p.m.

"We're hoping it's the start of successful season," said Coach Murphy.

According to Coach Murphy, Robbie Snipes, Jerry Anthony, and Bob Lemmonds are almost sure to be in the starting line-up. The other two positions aren't nearly as clear cut. "Eddie Goodall is making an even stronger bid for Don Keel's forward position, and Lane Hurley is making a bid for Bill Redmond's guard position," he explained.

The coach believes that it could be the final day of practice prior to the game with King before these positions have been decided. "In both cases each player has displayed talent in a particular phase of the game stronger than his competitor," he said.

Coach Murphy explained that "the team is not in condition but if it is possible to remedy this situation in the short time we have, it will be done."

There have been some impro-vements, however. "Our shooting and ball-handling ability has improved. The rebounding will probably be the key if we have a highly successful season," he said.

"We know nothing about the King College Tornadoes except that they won ten and lost 14 in their 1965-1966 season, but we're making it a point to try to find out something before we play them," coach related.

"We're very anxious to play," Coach Murphy said. "We think we have a good basketball team, and the game with King will certainly
