Selecting the four from a field of approximately forty hopefuls was the task given to a six member election board. Members of this board were: Dr. Harvey Murphy, basketball and cross-country coach; Mr. Paul Fleming, wrestling and golf coach; Mrs. Dorothy Dunn, faculty member; Robbie Snipes and Jerry Anthony, co-captains of the basketball team, and John Gaither, president of the Student Body. Miss Mildred English, advisor to the cheerleaders, chose the faculty members to be on the election committee.

To make sure that the empty positions would be filled, a change was made in the guide lines, making it possible for entering freshmen to be eligible to go out for cheerleader. Previously, the selection of the cheering squad was made during the second week in May, thus limiting the positions to students who were returning the next year. This year, however, some of the positions were vacated over the summer, making it necessary to choose new ones. The new cheerleaders will receive sweaters, megaphones, and letters to use during the year from the Student Government. They will also receive, as do the rest of the cheerleaders, money from the Student Government for traveling expenses and publicity needs.

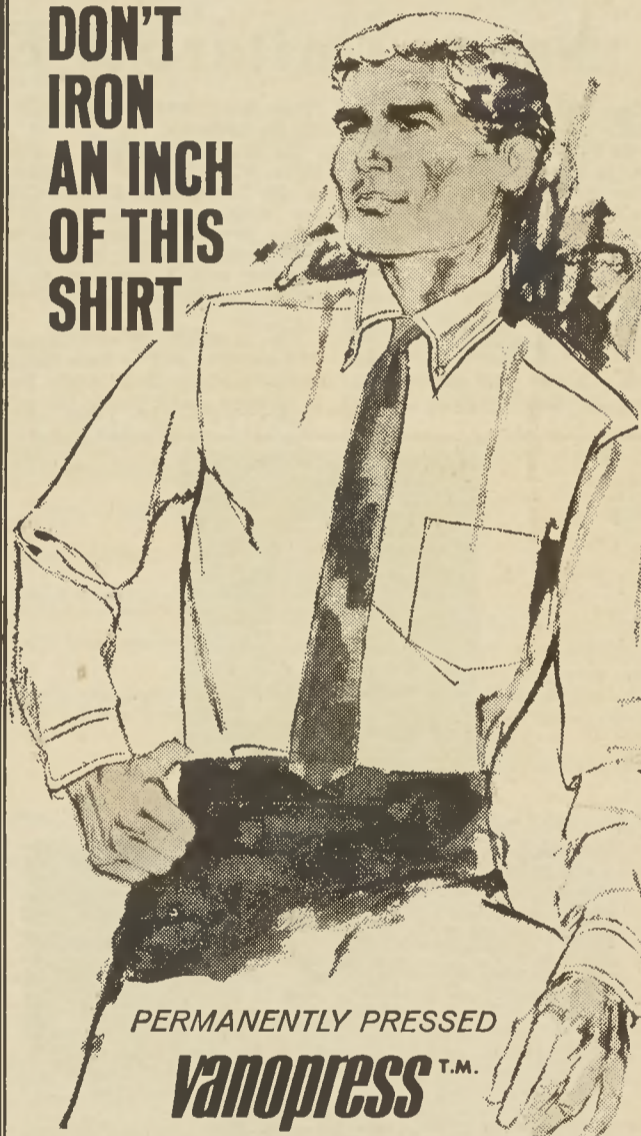
