

Harriers Victorious Over Methodist College

Methodist College fell to UNC-C 35-23 in a cross country meet on their course on Friday the 13th. Marth Fleming set a new DIAC record of 29:55 on a five mile course. This was 55 seconds better than the old conference record, also set by Marty Fleming. The previous record for Methodist's course was 30:15; this was set by a Pembroke runner.

Campbell College of Buies Creek, N. C. also ran in the meet. They ran only for practice

in competition, however, and had no affect on the scores of Methodist and unc-c.

Again group finishing helped win a meet for the 4934s. Larry McAfee, John Lafferty, Mike Ridge, Woody Frick, and John Byrd finished in fourth through eighth places respectively to leave the Monarchs only two of the prime scoring positions.

The harriers still remain undefeated in their three conference meets.

The cross country teams opening home meet, scheduled for October 19 with Greensboro College, was cancelled by Greensboro last Thursday, because they were unable to develop enough interest this season in the sport. Dr. Murphy, Director of Athletics, announced he was attempting to schedule another meet in its place.

Unless the alternate meet is announced, the 49ers next outing will be with Lynchburg College, at Charlotte, October 23.

Lynchburg and UNC-C are the only undefeated teams in DIAC, competition. The winner of this meet will go into the DIAC conference meet favored to win.

Team Has First Loss

In two dual meets on Monday, October 9, the UNC-C cross country team received its first non conference victory and defeat of the season.

"This is ridiculous. This is just ridiculous," were the words of Mr. Brenton Steele, track coach, upon learning that the meet was to begin four minutes after the UNC-C harriers returned from jogging the two mile course which was to be run twice to make Davidson's four mile course. The wildcats then easily outran the 49ers 19-39.

This loss was partly compensated for by the fact that Davidson defeated Western Carolina University 15-48 (15-50 being a perfect score) and that our runners defeated WCU 19-37. In the running against WCU the 49ers finished first, third, fourth, fifth, and sixth. This group finishing has proved to be one of the boys' stronger points.

This gave the cross country team a 2-0 record in the conference and a 3-2 record overall.
