Improve Service

A project designed to stimulate and motivate children from deprived homes, which began last summer at UNC-C, will be carried into the winter. Project Opportunity is designed to motivate those students who have not reached their full capabilities, due to the environmental conditions to which they are subjected.

Working with Mr. Chris B. Sanford, principal of Irwin Ave. Jr. High School, the program was originated last summer, when 30 students attended classes directed by faculty members here, for a three week period.

The curriculum is designed to bring the child to a proficient reading level, by building his vocabulary. Speech and pronunciation are other areas in which remedial work will be done.

Dr. Bonnie E. Cone, vice chancellor for student affairs and community relations, has led campus efforts to get an amphitheater. She said that the amphitheater was designed ultimately more for musical productions rather than for theater.
