Elected at this meeting were Mike Carmichael, as president; and Sandra Hoover as Secretary. Sue Garrett was appointed as chairman of the Constitution Committee.

Carmichael said that it was his impression that the History Club would provide an organization for students interested in history to discuss their views

and also to provide an organization to sponsor function of a social nature with historic overtone.

He was also quick to point out that "the History Club was in no way in competition with other clubs and further, that it is distinctly and markedly different than any other club on campus."

Carmichael also welcomes all members of other clubs with historic interest to participate in the newly formed club.

He also said that, "since we do not have an advisor at this time, we welcome the advice of any member of the History Department."

The long-range goals of the History Club include:

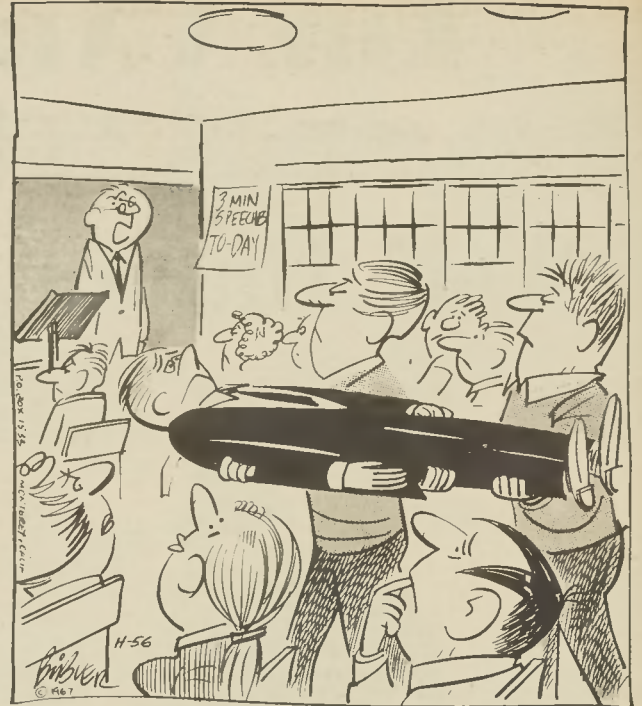

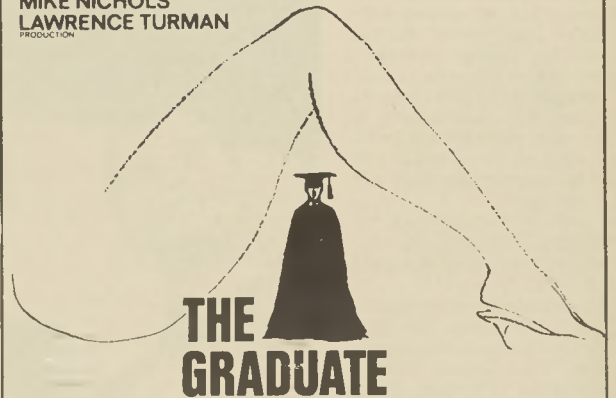
