Rieke Speaks To SCL On Fascism

Dr. R. W. Rieke addressed the Senior Classical League on the subject of fascism on February 21. The fascist era, he said, was the two decades between the two World Wars, a time when two large powers, the United States and Russia were in nearisolation from world affairs. The conservative organic concept of the state was followed by the fascist govern-

ments. The individual was like a cell in a living organism with the singular party functioning as the organism's brain. At the same time, however, a major radical idea was embraced; that there is no possibility of perpetual peace.

Mussolini described fascism well when he said that it was not a doctrine of ideology and that the party was neither left nor right but both left and right.
