

# Campus Boils Over Legislature Action

 not be able to re-do this section. Following debate, the Board voted unanimously in favor of a motion presented by Dr. Julian Mason which reiterated the Board's policy of non-interference in editorial decisions unless libel or extremely bad taste was involved. At the March 11 legislature meeting, Sue Garrett, the senior representative who presented the motion from the seniors, referred to the action asked for in the

motion as a "last resort." Several meetings were held last week in which many questions concerning the action of the legislature have been discussed. At a final meeting of the representatives of each class appointed by the legislature, Dean of Students Donald MacKay, and Vice Chancellor Bonnie Cone, a compromise to the situation was reached. Administration over-ruled the action of the student legislature and declared that the legislature

had no right to revoke funds already allocated to the annual. The compromise calls for a group of students not on the annual staff to re-edit the controversial class section in keeping with the presently designated total number of pages and leaving all pictures the same size. The legislature will pay the extra \$32 the change of plans will cost. According to Miss Kimbrell, the final publication for the Rogues 'n Rascals will be late one day for every day this re-arrangement re-

quires. The book may be as much as two weeks late already when last week's delay is taken into account. In other business, chairman of the finance committee Larry L. Garner reported that his committee had considered the \$1250 additional budget request of the Union. Due to a rise in enrollment for spring semester above what had been anticipated, the committee now has \$3900 more to allocate.

Garner reported that the committee had cut the amount to appear in the motion he presented to the legislature to \$500. After defeating motions of the original \$1250 and a compromise of \$750 which came from the floor, the matter was referred back to the committee stage. Another item of business was the acceptance of Bob Alexander as Student Court Judge in replacement of Bud Stokely, who has resigned.

## N. Carolina Laws Now Available In Library

The text of laws which govern some 5,000,000 residents of the Tar Heel state have recently become available in the Atkins Library. These laws appear in the General Statutes of North Carolina, a twelve volume set recently acquired by the Library.

Ten of the volumes contain the general laws (with annotations) as enacted through the 1963 session of the General Assembly. The remaining two volumes con-

tain laws enacted during the 1965 session. Legislation enacted in the 1967 session appears in the 1967 Session Laws.

The twelve volumes, including a two-volume index, are arranged chronologically by chapter. Each chapter contains laws relating to a particular subject field such as

insurance, roads and highways, elections, and higher education. Altogether the General Statutes contain 167 chapters. An appendix to the General Statutes contains the North Carolina Constitution, rules of practice in the state supreme court and superior courts, rules governing admission to the practice of law, and rules, organization, and canons of ethics of the North Carolina State Bar. Prepared under the supervision of the North Carolina Department of Justice, the General Statutes is published by the Michie Company of Charlottesville, Virginia.

Both the General Statutes and Session Laws are available in the Caroliniana Room on the second floor of the Atkins Library.

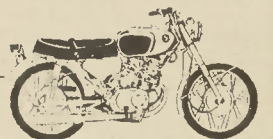

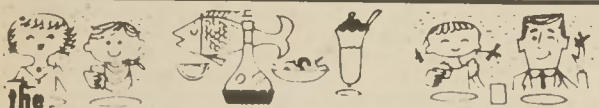
