

A Filmac 400 M reader-printer designed for making a permanent copy from microfilm is the latest addition to the list of equipment acquired by the Atkins Library. The semi-automatic reader-

printer, manufactured by the Min-nesota Mining and Manufacturing Company, is designed for printing company, is designed for printing from either 16mm or 35mm roll microfilm or microfilm in aper-ture cards. The reader-printer is equipped with an accessory adapter which can be used for printing from microfiche up to 5 x 8" in size. The play will be presented April 4, 5, 6 at 8 P.M. in C-200 of the ABC complex and admission will be 75 cents.




