Auten, Burks Seek Vice Presidency Of SGA

The third candidate for student body president is Hank Heidenreich. Mr. Heidenreich is running as an independent. He feels the office of president should be filled by an independent which will be a representative of all the students.

"I would like to see more active participation with local campuses for programs," stated Mr. Heidenreich. "This would ease the financial situation in order to obtain finer programs."

He has recently been elected president of the Young Democrats Club and has served as program chairman for the Students for ACTION.

The University Party candidate for vice-president is Stewart Auten. Mr. Auten has been "encouraged by supporters and is looking forward to a good strong campaign."

He believes his new approach to legislature will be a good one and will produce results that the students desire.

Mr. Auten stated that with a growing University, the problems also grow and that it is up to

the legislature to meet the new challenges.

He is president of A.P.O. and was advertising manager of the annual. He has been attending the legislative meetings for experience.

Jerrold Burks is an independent candidate for vice-president. His main interest is in the students. He would like to see the students and administration working together for more student authority.

Mr. Burks desires more interest on the part of the students in the University and likewise that they have more voice in student affairs.

He stated his main qualification, his interest in the students.

A candidate for the consolidated University Council is Julia Lonon. Miss Lonon is a junior and is running on the Student Party ticket. She feels she is qualified for the position because of her experi-

She has represented the students previously as sophomore representative and has also served as Miss UNC-C. She wants to see UNC-C represented on a more equal level with the other branches of the University rather than just "a small college."

All Major Positions Are Hotly Contested

The general elections of April 3-5 could very well be the most exciting ever since all major positions are hotly contested. Election Committee Chairman, Joe McCorkle, has announced that, "I would like to see the students surpass the 47% turn-out last year."

Campaign speeches will begin today at noon in the cafeteria, with voting immediately after the speeches. The polls will be located adjacent to the cafeteria and will remain open until 4:30 p.m. today. Voting will also take place at ABC Breezeway. Nigh students will vote Wednesday and Thursday at the ABC Breezeway from 5:30 until 8:00 p.m.

On Thursday and Friday the polls will open at 9:30 a.m. and will close at 4:30 p.m.

Mr. McCorkle had a further plea to bring to the students. "During the Union Election, the position of secretary was vacant since no qualified candidate filed. As a result, 90 different individuals (including Phil Blundel, etc.) received votes. 72 of these 'candidates' did not meet the qualifications for the office. Only legal write-ins count," he explained.

"For this reason," he continued, "students are urged by the Elections Committee to take their write-in privileges seriously by writing-in those candidates who meet the qualifications for the office and have aspirations to it."

In the election to select the person who will represent the student

body on the Publications Board, one candidate will be chosen for a two-year term. This position will be a complete write-in position since no qualified candidate filed.

Candidates must be current members of the Sophomore Class and must have an overall scholastic average of at least 2.00 to be eligible for the office.

All currently enrolled students, regardless of status, are eligible to vote for all positions. Students do not have to register to vote but they must have their I. D. card when they come to the polls.
