



McCarthy Wins Mock Election Held By Young Republicans

The Young Republicans Club on campus sponsored UNC-C's answer to the Gallup Poll last Wednesday; perhaps the results will be enlightening.

The polling place was well attended by YRC members and curious onlookers. Bystanders in the Union lobby could've overheard

the sounds of a political non-machine in action: "Have you voted yet?" "for president, governor, and liquor by the drink, and all that." "No--you don't have to show your ID." "Write-in what ever name you like." "Please circle the party of your choice." "I hear they're doing this on the Queens campus too." "Yes sir, non-students can vote too."

The ballots, containing the names of all prominent presidential and gubernatorial candidates, allowed voters to select candidates not only of their own party but also of other affiliation. The ballots also gave voters an opportunity to show their approval or disapproval of liquor by the drink and a tobacco tax.

Participation by the student body and all interested onlookers was heavy, with nearly 500 votes being cast in little less than four hours. There were a few instances of students voting more than once, but such irregularities were held to a minimum; we might therefore suppose that the results are indicative of something.

Perhaps the most interesting results of the mock-election were the surprising strengths of Senator McCarthy and Richard Nixon. Closer examination of the ballots revealed certain inconsistencies which would seem to indicate that some took the mock-election with mock-seriousness; Republicans voting for Wallace and Hawkins, Democrats voting for Stickley and against Tobacco taxes, etc. 378 votes were cast in support of liquor by the drink, with 88 opposed, while 344 advocated a tobacco tax and 113 voted against the same.

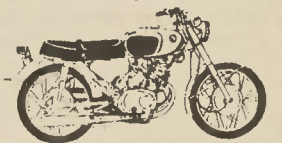
