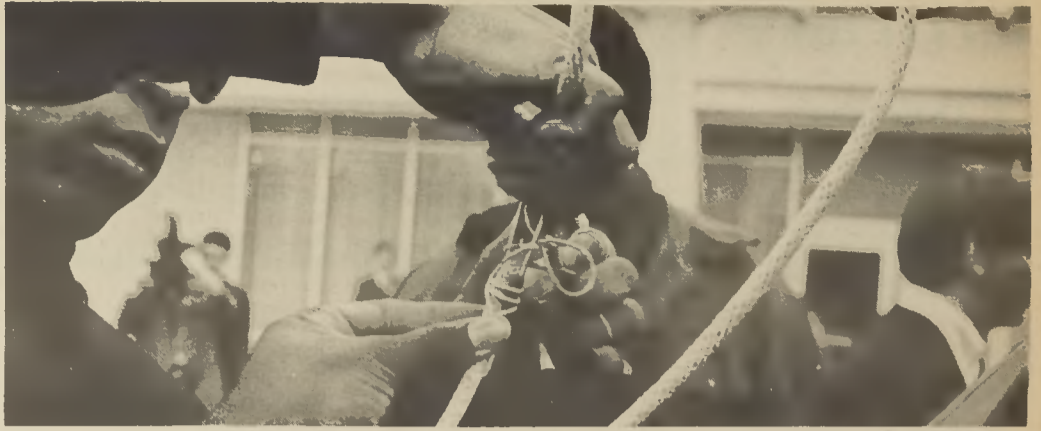

Several UNC-C students and professors met beneath the flag pole in front of the administration building last Friday to commemorate the deaths of three young Negroes in last year's Orangeburg riots. The ceremonies were sponsored by Students for Action, a campus involvement-oriented organization. The proceedings

were highlighted by a speech by Reginald Hawkins, a controversial leader of the local blacks, and the hoisting of a black flag to a

half-mast position on the pole. Dr. Hawkins encouraged local students not to remain inactive while their rights were trod upon.
