Cage Schedule Released

by michael mcculley A slam-bam schedule of basketball action was unveiled by Coach Bill Foster on May 2. The '71-'72 season features games with 17 University division opponents (up from 11 last year), a home-and-home series with Marshall University, and dates with Mississippi State, Tulane, Loyola of New Orleans and Oklahoma highlight the contests.

The 49ers will undertake a 25-game slate, that includes East Tennessee State, Appalachian, South Florida, Valparaiso, DePaul, University of Tennessee-Chattanooga, and LSU-New Orleans, the nation's top-ranked college division team this past season.

A phenomenal seventeen home games are planned, with eight road games (the last three away) completing the basic schedule. Fourteen home contests will be in the new gym and three contests are slated for Charlotte's Coliseum.


