The Baccalaureate Services for this year's graduates will be held June 3, 1956 at the Hawthorne Lane Methodist Church and will begin at 7:30 p.m. The Rev. W. Jackson Huneycutt will speak. The text of Rev. Huneycutt's sermon will be "Facing Up to Life". Charlotte College students and faculty are cordially invited to attend these ceremonies.

Mr. Huneycutt was born in Albemarle, N. C., in 1910. He graduated from Davidson College in 1932 and from Duke University in 1939. He also attended a graduate school at Boston University from 1940-41.

Rev. Huneycutt was the District Superintendent of Waynesville from 1951-55, a member of the Western North Carolina Conference Board of Ministerial Training from 1940-41, and also on the Board of Evangelism from 1948-50. In 1956, Rev. Huneycutt has held positions on the Board of Trustees of the Children's Home, has been a delegate to the Jurisdictional Conference, and a delegate to the General Council.

Rev. Huneycutt is married and has two sons and a daughter. He has been pastor of the Hawthorne Lane Methodist Church since 1955.
