dents who have demonstrated by examination their ability in college work.

d) "That flat sums shall be included in the grants-in-aid in support of administrative costs and in support of libraries and laboratories in relation to the predetermined limited course offerings mentioned above.

e) "That the only state support as higher education for the work described as Diversified Adult Education shall be a modest contribution toward administrative costs associated with continuing surveys of needs for and potential enrollment in offerings described as Diversified Adult Education, and with the negotiations leading to contracts with business and industrial and civic organizations and institutions, including hospitals, for educational services.

f) "That this method of support be defined as experimental for the period of the biennium . . ."

If used with the regular .44 cartridge the 3 lb. gun absorbs the recoil so well that one may well suspect that he was firing a much smaller caliber handgun if he did not know the difference.

The gun sells for \$135 and is an excellent buy for one who wants a large caliber revolver that uses two different types of ammunition.
