The program was open to the public for the admission price of one dollar and was free to the students upon presentation of their activity cards.

Miss Peterson compared many contemporary authors with writers of old. She also said that psychoanalysis was encroaching upon individualism.

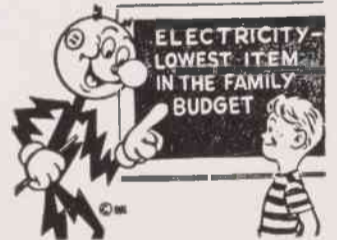
