## Financial Report

On April 30, Robert E. Alexander submitted his report of the income and expenditures of the Student Council for 1962-63. Income for the year exceeded $\$ 16,500$, and expenditures of approximately $\$ 8,500$ left a balance in excess of $\$ 8,000$.
