Both branches of the General Assembly organized with dispatch on Wednesday. The Senators were sworn by Lieutenant Governor Reynolds. O. C. Landis, of Wilson, was made chief clerk and Walter Murphy, of Rowan, reading-clerk. F. A. Church, of Cabarrus, was elected negro clerk. J. D. Smith, of Concord, was elected door-keeper and M. W. White a stenographer.

One of the first acts of the body was to reduce the wages of clerks from \$5 per day to \$4.

The House was called to order by J. T. Maston, principal clerk of the last House, and the body was led in prayer by Rev. Jesus Page. The members were then sworn in by Justice Clark.
