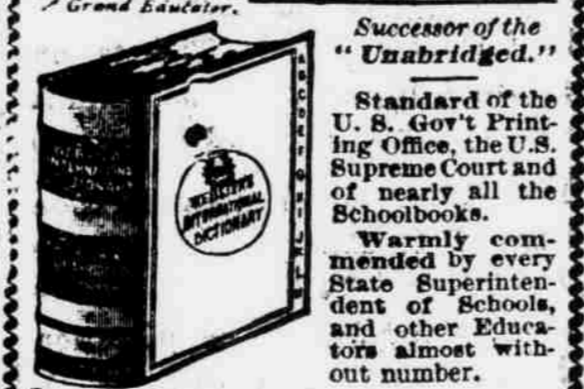
Are You Going?

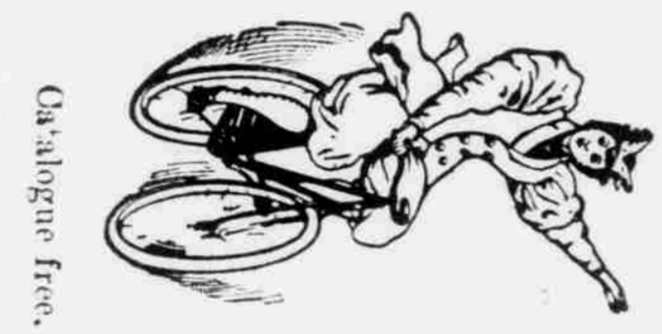
