The Presbytery extended the right of fellowship to Mr. Soulier, after which it adjourned with prayer by Dr. Ruple.

HE WAS IN CHARLOTTE.

The Man Who Sent the Infernal Machine by Mail Remembered Here.

In the Observer's press dispatches Tuesday was the news of a Mrs. Mattie Chambers, a widow who lives at Centralia, Wash., who had received an infernal machine, containing dynamite, through the mails. It is claimed that it was sent her by Rev. B. F. Fuller, a rejected suitor, who is now in Raleigh. The postmaster saw brown paper sticking out of the end of the box and pried the lid off without igniting the match, thus saving the woman's life.

His name corresponds with that in the dispatch, and while here he was always talking of Centralia, and of a widow who had rejected him. He paid several ladies of the city attention.
