### TOWN ORDINANCE.

Be it ordained by the Commissioners of the Town of Concord, N. C.:

That any one who shall commit a nuisance on either the white or colored graded school grounds, or who shall throw a rock or ball on said grounds, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be fined Ten Dollars or imprisoned for Ten Days.

Provided:—This ordinance shall not prohibit playing ball by the pupils of said schools during the school term. This ordinance shall be in effect on and after June 12, 1895. By order of Board.
