Section 2, And be it ordained by
the commissioners for the town of Concord : That any one who shall ride a bioycle on any sidewalk withr
in the corporate limits of the tow in the corporate limits of the town
of Conoord. N. C. shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon
conviction theren shall be fined conviction theref shall be fined
five dollars or imprisoned for to days.
Section 3. Any one who shall ride
bieycle across any of the publie bicyole across any of the public ts of the town of Concord at a
reater speed than an ordinary walk reater speed than an ordinary walk
hall be deemed guilty of a misuen meanor and upon conviction there,
prisoned for ten days.
