BICYCLE ORDINANCE.

Be it ordained by the commissioners for the towr of Concord, N. C.: Section 1 That the bicycle ordinances Nos. 73 and 77 respectively passed by the board on the Ilth day of September, 1894 and on the 13th day of August, 1895 be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 2. And be it ordained by the commissioners for the town of Concord : That any one who shall ride a bicycle on any sidewalk withare good buildings, orchards and in the corporate limits of the town conveniences for home comfort on of Concord, N. Section 3 Any one who shall ride a bicycle across any of the public crossings within the corporate limits of the town of Concord at a greater speed than an ordinary walk shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined five dollars or imprisoned for ten days.
