BICYCLE ORDINANCE.

Be it ordained by the commissioners for the town of Concord, N. C.:
Section 1. That the bicycle ordinance Nos. 78 and 77 respectively passed by the board on the 11th day of September, 1894 and on the 13th day of August, 1895 be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 2. And be it ordained by the commissioners for the town of Concord: That any one who shall ride a bicycle on any sidewalk within the corporate limits of the town of Concord, N. C. shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined five dollars or imprisoned for ten days.

Section 3. Any one who shall ride a bicycle across any of the public crossings within the corporate limits of the town of Concord at a greater speed than an ordinary walk shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined five dollars or imprisoned for ten days.

This ordinance shall be in effect on and after August, 23, 1895. By order of board.

ANOTHER ISSUE OF BONDS.

President Hutchison of the Corn Exchange Bank, Authority for the Statement That the Same Syndicate will Handle Them—Cleveland Wants An Issue of \$25,000,000, while the syndicate Hold Out for \$50,000,000.

CHICAGO, Ill., Sept. 14.—Charles L. Hutchison, president of the Corn Exchange Bank, of this city said today. "I have it on the best authority from New York that another issue of bonds has been arranged for between the government and the Morgan-Beimont syndicate I received information yesterday and I understand the only delay in issuing the new batch of bonds is on account of the amount, I believe President Cleveland desires to sell only \$25,000,000 worth of bonds now, while the syndicate wants the issue to be at least \$50,000,000. I know nothing of the proposed terms, but I expect the announcement of the loan will be made in a day or so. I do not think the issue of more bonds will have any effect on the general business. It may depress the price of securities temporarily, but that would not make much difference."

Chicago bankers, interviewed today, said they saw no cause for alarm in the increasing shipments of gold to Europe. All said the country's commercial condition was good, and there was no danger of a recurrence of the 1893 panic on account of the impairment of the gold reserve in the Treasury.
