THE PRIZE-FIGHT OFF.

The Representatives of Corbett and Fitzsimmons Could Not Get Together on a Date.

HOT SPRINGS, Ark., Oct. 21.—The Corbett-Fitzsimmons fight has been declared off by the Florida Athletic Club. Corbett and Brady were willing to postpone the fight to November 11, but Julian, as Fitzsimmons' representative, was not and the club then declared the match off. The negotiations were brief and not in the best temper. Each side charged the other with an attempt either to get the better of the bargain or to kill the fight altogether. Both sides are clamorously charging cowardice, etc.

HOT SPRINGS, Ark., Oct. 21.—At the conference between the Florida Athletic Club official and the managers of Corbett and Fitzsimmons, the club asked for a postponement of the contest to November 11. Brady agreed to this but Julian steadfastly refused to concur. There was a wordy wrangle and finally the club declared the fight off. Brady then announced that Corbett was prepared to fight any man in the world on November 11, Robert Fitzsimmons preferred, the man to be named within 24 hours.

At the conclusion of the talk, Martin Julian, Fitzsimmons' manager, said: "I did all I could to make a satisfactory arrangement, but the Corbett people would not listen to reason. I offered to let Fitzsimmons fight Corbett in private for the side bet, but they would not agree to it. They wanted a postponement to November 11th, which was merely another way of saying that they did not want to fight at all. Of course I declined to listen to the proposition. Vendig and his crowd tried their best to job us but we would not have it."

Brady, on the other hand charges that Julian flaked, and that he would not have agreed to anything, "except a title to the whole State of Arkansas with Governor Clark's office to sleep in," as he expressed it. Vendig announced that he would match Peter Maher against Corbett for \$5,000.

The outcome of the muddle cannot be foretold, but it looks as though there will be a fight of some kind on November 11th.
