ATLANTA, Ga., November 11.—The Daughters of the Confederacy held their meeting Saturday in the auditorium at the Exposition. Their audience numbered 3,000. Representatives of the society were present from every Southern State and from many other States. Mrs. E. P. McDarrell Wolf presided. Dr. G. B. Strickler, of Atlanta, offered the opening prayer. Mrs. Helen G. Lane, president of the Atlanta chapter, made the address of welcome.

Negro Judge in Albany.

ALBANY, N. Y., Nov. 8.—James C. Matthew (colored), formerly Recorder of Deeds at Washington, D. C., under President Cleveland's first administration, has been elected Judge of the Recorder's court of this city, which office carries with it powers of a Supreme Court Judge. His majority is over 20,000. He was nominated and elected on the regular Democratic ticket. It is the highest judicial office ever held by a man of his race in this country.
