The Bible in Public Schools.
CHICAGO, Ill., Nov. 15.—Sixty-thousand men and women who believe the Bible should be read in the public schools in a non-sectarian manner have signed a petition to that effect which will soon be presented to the board of education. Signatures are still being obtained. The petition has been prepared and is being circulated by the Woman's Educational Union, of Chicago. Letters of endorsement have been received from Cardinal Satolli, Archbishop Janssen, New Orleans; Bishop Keane, rector of the Catholic University, Washington; Bishop Heslin, Natchez, Miss.; Bishop Hennessy, Kohler, for the Jewish Congregation of New York; Bishop Fallows, of the Methodist church; President Harper, University of Chicago, and President Rogers, of the Northwestern University. It is proposed to have a committee, representing the various churches, prepare selections from the Scriptures to be read.

Assessment Held Against Jay Gould's Estate.
NEW YORK, Nov. 15.—The general term of the Supreme Court today handed down a decision in which they sustain the special term in dismissing a writ of certiorari asked for by the executors of the estate of Jay Gould to review the action of the tax commissioners in assessing them upon \$10,000,000 of real property. The assessment \$10,000,000 made by the commissioners for 1893 therefore stands.

The Constitutional Convention.
COLUMBIA, S. C., Nov. 15.—The Constitutional Convention devoted the day to a discussion of the proposed increase of the poll tax. The proposition to make it \$2 and \$1.50, instead of \$1, were voted down. The committee reporting in favor of exempting all persons sixty years old and over from the poll tax.
